Season Update - COVID Impacts

Welcome to all of our Members,

I'd like to start by introducing myself as the Laurimar Cricket Club Covid Co-ordinator for the 20/22 Cricket season. As we know we are currently living in a time that we have never experienced before and most of us have been impacted in many ways.

The Committee have been working through the administrative requirements to be able to have protocols in place to manage Covid -19 once we have been provided the approval to commence our season. Unfortunately with the restrictions we have had in place in Metropolitan Victoria we had no real visibility on how we would be able to operate until today.

So to keep this notice as basic as I can without going into a great amount of detail I'll provide the following information-

Laurimar Cricket Club has adopted a Community Covid -19 plan that requires us to manage the Laurimar Cricket Club in line with Government Requirements and

The club has also created a Covid 19 Safety Plan that allows us to operate the club in the safest way we believe we can to make sure that not only our players, our families and our community will be safe while we participate in the sport we love.

These two mentioned plans will live on our website in the coming days.

Also it is a requirement under our Safety Plan that we provide a brief to our members to allow a complete understanding of the club's position on Covid and the expectations of both associations we play under and Cricket Victoria. We will be looking to finalise this presentation later in the week. So stay tuned for this.

The club has put in place a QR code system that requires every player, spectator and visitor to scan in on arrival and scan out on departure. More information will be provided around this requirement.

All coaches and coordinators are aware of the social distancing requirements while training and on game day and I would ask that all spectators/ Visitors also comply with this requirement to avoid any potentially spread. And Yes masks are to be worn while attending the club until we are advised from DHHS or the appropriate Government department.

We will require a Covid-19 Officer for every team associated with Laurimar Cricket Club that will be responsible in providing information to families from the committee and making sure the basic compliance is in place within the specific team they are associated with (Attendance registration). I would ask that if you are interested please contact your coach / Coordinator / or Committee member that will allow me to send out a link for your 30 min introduction course.

Training will have sanitiser stations around the ground and we will be enforcing strict compliance to using these facilities throughout the sessions. The club rooms will not be open apart from access to toilets until approval is provided from the City of Whittlesea so please make sure you bring your own drinks as required.

We are anticipating to have the facilities available for training from Monday 2nd November but is dependant on Covid -19 protocols being complied with.
